1. The goal of the Bainbridge Island Saddle Club (BISC) Schooling Shows is to offer a series of fun and affordable shows promoting good sportsmanship, horsemanship and encouraging equine competition in our local area in a friendly atmosphere.
2. Entry fees: \$10 per class for members and \$15 for non-members. Prizes to 1st and ribbons awarded through 8<sup>th</sup> place. **High Point Prizes will be awarded to members** in the following divisions: Trot Pole Hunters, Cross Rail Hunters, Tiny Hunters, Short/Long Stirrup, Pre-Child/Adult, and Jumper classes 22 – 25. Members also qualify for **year-end awards** and accrue points in the first six classes in which they are judged at each show. Membership forms are available in the office.
3. Schooling: The main show ring will be open for schooling until 8:45. At 8:45, the ring will be closed to open schooling and is reserved for the walk/trot competitors. The warm-up arena located to the south of the main ring will be available throughout the day for additional schooling.
4. No rider cross- entry between classes 1-11 and 13-25. You may school any class (not to be judged and no year-end points) by turning your number upside down and going at the end of the order. Please alert the office staff of your intentions.
5. Show management reserves the right to deny entry to any exhibitor or spectator for any reason. Classes may be combined, cancelled or changed at the discretion of show management.
6. ASTM approved protective headgear and proper footwear is required for all exhibitors and must be worn at all times when mounted.
7. Judge's cards may be available for viewing. Please contact the Office for more information.
8. Concessions will be available during the show.
9. **Pole stalls may be reserved** for \$10 for the day. Reservations are required and are on a first come basis. Please call Leslie Cox (206)842-1575 or email at lcox@blueskywood.com. All stalls must be cleaned at the end of the day or future reservations may be jeopardized.
10. Class sponsorships are available. Please contact Sara Papajani (206)780-5322 for information and benefits.
11. The Saddle Club Show grounds will be closed the day before each schooling show for maintenance and set up.
12. Dogs must be kept on leashes at all times.
13. Year-End Award Age Divisions are: 10 & Under Flat, 10 & Under Over Fences, 11-13 Flat, 11-13 Over Fences, 14-18 Flat, 14-18 Over Fences, Adult Flat, and Adult Over Fences. Divisions are based on the rider's age as of December 1<sup>st</sup> of the prior year. Year end awards are for members only.
14. BISC will not be responsible for injury or damage to any animal, person or property of the exhibitor, spectator, groom, attendant or any employee. The exhibitor, spectator, groom, attendant or any employee shall hold the Bainbridge Island Saddle Club harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any accident or injury.
