The warm-up arena is available throughout the day for additional schooling.

A Daily High Point Prize will be awarded to the competitor who accrues the most points in the classes listed for each category below. **Only one High Point may be awarded to a horse/rider combo per show.**

Trot Pole Hunters (classes 8, 9, 10, 11)
Cross Rail Hunters (classes 12, 13, 14, 15)

Tiny Hunters (classes 16, 17, 18, 19)
Short/Long Stirrup (classes 21, 22, 23, 24)
Pre-Child/Adult (classes 23, 24, 25, 26)
Children's/Adult (classes 27, 28, 29, 30)

BISC Schooling Shows

The goal of the Bainbridge Island Saddle Club (BISC) Schooling Shows is to offer a series of fun and affordable shows for the amateur equestrian, promoting good sportsmanship and horsemanship, and encouraging local equestrian competition in a friendly atmosphere.

Facility Policies

1. BISC will not be responsible for injury or damage to any animal, person or property of the exhibitor, spectator, groom, attendant or any employee. The exhibitor, spectator, groom, attendant or any employee shall hold the Bainbridge Island Saddle Club harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any accident or injury.
2. Show management reserves the right to deny entry to any exhibitor or spectator for any reason. Show staff reserves the right to correct improper tack and apparel before exhibitor is allowed to compete.
3. ASTM/SEI certified protective headgear and proper footwear are required for all exhibitors and must be worn at all times when mounted. Apparel with hoods or attached strings is not allowed.
4. Dogs must be kept on leashes at all times, and no dogs are permitted in the arenas.
5. Manure is to be immediately removed from arenas and grounds and deposited in manure bins.
6. The Saddle Club arenas will be closed the day before each schooling show for maintenance and set up. Any additional closures will be posted in advance on the website.

Show Policies

1. **Entry fees:** \$15 per class for members and \$20 for non-members. **No refunds will be given on scratches once a class has begun.**
2. The Liability Waiver and Rules & Regulations Agreement, **signed by parent/legal guardian**, must be turned in **prior to first class.**
3. Jumper Class Categories:
 - a. SPEED (Table II, Sec 1) – Object is to have fastest round with no rails down. No jump-off.
 - b. POWER & SPEED (Table II, Sec 2(c)) – First half emphasizes power; object is to jump clean with no time faults. If clear (no whistle), rider continues on to second half without stopping and object is to be fastest with no rails down. However, if not clear in first half (whistle blows), then rider exits ring.
 - c. JUMP-OFF – Upon completion of clear round, whistle blows and rider proceeds with 45 seconds to shortened jump-off course.
 - d. OPTIMUM TIME (Table IV, Sec 1) – Optimum Time is established and posted on jump course. Cleanest round closest (over and under) to Optimum Time wins.
4. Any flat class with more than 12 entries will be split and pinned separately.
5. Classes may be combined, cancelled or changed at the discretion of show management.
6. No rider cross-entry between class 1 and 6, and classes 7-19 and 20-30.
7. Riders may school any class (not to be judged and no year-end points) by turning number upside down and going at the end of the order. Please alert the office staff of your intentions.
8. Prizes go to 1st place and ribbons awarded through 8th place.
9. Prizes will be awarded in the following **Daily High Points:** Low Jumpers, High Jumpers, Trot Pole Hunters (Pony and Horse sections), Cross Rail Hunters, Tiny Hunters, Short/Long Stirrup, and Pre-Child/Adult. **Only one High Point may be awarded to a horse/rider combination per show.**
10. Members may accrue points towards **Year-End Awards** in the first six classes (to include a max of 4 jumper classes) in which they are judged at each show. Exhibitors may accrue points on only one horse per show. **Year-End Award Age Divisions** are: 10y & Under Flat, 10y & Under Over Fences, 11-13y Flat, 11-13y Over Fences, 14-18y Flat, 14-18y Over Fences, Adult Flat, and Adult Over Fences. Divisions are based on the rider's age as of December 1st of the prior year. **Points begin to accrue at the point membership is activated.**
11. The member trainer with the highest accrued member points among his/her riders may qualify for the **Trainer Year-End Award. Only points accrued during a trainer's and riders' active membership are eligible to be counted.**
12. Membership registration may be completed online at www.bainbridgesaddleclub.org. This must be completed upon closing your show tab, in order for you to receive member rates and accrue points for the show.
13. Judge's cards may be available for viewing. Please contact the office for more information.
14. **Pole stalls** may be reserved for \$20 for the day for members and \$25 for non-members. Reservations are recommended and are on a first come basis. Reservations will initially be capped at 6 stalls per barn, but more can be requested and will be allotted if space is available. Please text Jackie Chipman at 206-310-7478 to reserve. All stalls must be thoroughly cleaned upon leaving or future reservations may be jeopardized. Hay may be fed in the pole stalls from hay nets only, not from the ground.
15. In lieu of a stall fee, a haul-in fee of \$5 will be assessed per rider.
16. Concessions will be available during the show.
